Separately, Frank and Eileen won an award from the Cork Environmental Forum for all the work they have done and continue to do for our planet. COVID19 – Project work continues but Staff working from Home

With the third lockdown staff continue to work mostly from home. This situation is likely to continue for some weeks.

Additional HSE Funding

We are delighted that the HSE has provided us with €100,000 once-off for 2021: this is significantly higher that we received last year and in 2019. All of this is needed as there are significant additional costs because of COVID19. Much of the funding will to be used to subsidise participation in our courses to support inclusion.

Annual Gathering - Nov 6th

We had a very successful and enjoyable SHEP Annual Gathering on Friday, November 6th. Over 100 people participated. This was our first on-line Annual Gathering, and it facilitated easy attendance by people from at least seven counties. We are planning an informal gathering in February, to keep the momentum going.

Welcome to Two New Staff

We are delighted to welcome two new part-time staff to SHEP for 2021: Carmel Savage joins the Coisceim team, working two days per week, on the new TUSLA funded initiative to provide counselling supports to adolescents and young adults. Robert O'Herlihy also joins us, also working part-time, in a new role (Communication and Technical Support and Worker). Robert has strong technical experience and will support us in the Project to continue our work to develop new or modernized internal systems. This position is part-funded by our American supporters Perry and Sandy Massie Foundation. As a result of this recruitment we now have a team of 3 full time staff (Jim, Liam & Ger) and 13 part-time staff: this means that for 2021 we have the equivalent of 10 full time posts.

SHEP Computer Loan Scheme

With the COVID19 pandemic we are very aware that many are being left behind, and of an increasing 'digital divide'. In order to help address this we have started a number of initiatives, including a computer loan scheme. We are pleased that under a recent round of Mitigating Disadvantage Funding SHEP secured €5,000 which we will now use to purchase a further 10 laptop devises and headsets. This will mean we will now have 21 devices in our computer loan scheme.

Update on Current Courses

It's truly extraordinary that all SHEP training is on-line (for the moment at least). We started six Foundation Part 1 (Personal Development) courses in October (all fully on-line). We also started three (fully on-line) Foundation Part 2 (Social Awareness & Community Empowerment) courses. Two Continuing Personal Development Groups have just finished after a year working together (mostly on-line) and a new Continuing PD group has started in Limerick (again fully on-line). The two Facilitation Groups (which started in person last February) are continuing their training programme and will complete the course in March. The Advocacy course was successfully completed before Christmas. In addition a large number of short courses and workshops (all on-line) were delivered reaching people in a large number of counties across the country. This would have been unthinkable only twelve months ago.

SHEP Earth Aware

The popular Greening Our City Series webinar continues; on Tuesday January 26 at 2.30pm our guest is Gitty Korsuize an urban ecologist from Utrecht and the title is Building with Nature, examples from Utrecht. Email: shepearthaware@gmail.com for details. We also continue our very popular Friday's for Earth series on the second Friday of every Month at 7pm. Next month we will be looking at the importance of wetlands and the month of March will be dedicated to trees, so do join us for our lively informative talks with our partners Cork Environmental Forum.

SHEP Community of Practice (Spring Workshops)

In order to support SHEP Facilitators to be involved in on-line facilitation in the Autumn we organised a series of on-line workshops and seminars for August/September which were open to facilitators from all backgrounds. The seminars were all over-subscribed so 13 workshops were organised in total. These were very well received and gave opportunities for SHEP facilitators from different backgrounds to meet up. We have now arranged a follow up series of on-line workshops which will commence shortly.

SHEP Community Education

A huge amount of work has gone into support our community education courses in the context of COVID19. Most of the delivery for the coming months is now likely to be fully on-line. This January/February 2021, SHEP is offering further courses, again all on-line and all with no charge to participants.

Working on a New Logo for SHEP

Over the next few weeks we will be working with Coolgrey (who did some pro-bono work for us last year) on a revised Logo for SHEP. We have given them feedback on their initial ideas. We hope to bring the second draft to the consultation meeting to be held on Friday, February 12th. Once the new logo has been agreed we intend doing some work later in 2021 to update and unify how we present our work to the public. We have agreed not to change the name and to continue to use both 'Social and Health Education Project' and 'SHEP'.

Updating the SHEP Website

We have started work to update and improve the content and layout of our website. You will see incremental changes over the coming weeks. Robert O'Herlihy is our new Communications and Technical Support Worker and he will be leading this project.



SHEP's Approach to Facilitation

The Generative Dialogue Group has done a good deal of work in recent months to explore and document SHEP's approach to facilitation. We expect this drafting work to be concluded before Easter and we will be able to share this widely in the Project.

Diversifying the Facilitator Base in SHEP

As you know, the Management Committee agreed last year that we need to step up our work to bring in new facilitators into the Project and in particular to diversify the facilitation team in SHEP. It is accepted that this is a complex initiative that will take many years. The Generative Dialogue Group has been asked by the SHEP Management Committee to explore ways in which we might approach this important dimension of our work.

New Foundation Part 1 (Personal Development) Facilitators

Phase one of a new process to bring new people into this level of training in SHEP commenced last year: 16 people were included. Year 2 of this multi-year process has now commenced. We are deeply appreciative of the support of long experienced facilitators in SHEP to bring in new people into what is very important area of training.

Innovative Peer Training programme for SHEP Community Tutors

In order to support our Community Tutors to facilitate on-line and to develop new course materials we developed a peer training programme for 12 SHEP Tutors in facilitating on-line and the design of new training courses. This programme is now complete and was a great success. We now have plans to start a second group for a further 12 Community Tutors in the coming weeks.

Sahakarmi (Nepal): Deepening our links with Development Fund Norway

The Coronavirus has also caused considerable disruption to programmes and daily life in Nepal. Restrictions on movement were lifted in November which meant that Sahakarmi Staff were able to return to work in the field, although the situation is worsening there again. COVID19 made it challenging to complete the intended work-programme for 2020 – but the team there have done trojan work in difficult circumstances and have met most of the targets set out with Irish Aid. This is our fourth three-year (Irish Aid funded) programme of support with Sahakarrmi.

New Management Committee members

During the year ahead we will be bringing on some new members to the SHEP Management Committee. We are particularly seeking nominees from the Advocacy Programme, the Counselling Programme and SHEP Earth Aware. We are also seeking a retired accountant who might be able to join us – if you know of anyone who might be interested do let us know. A very big thank you to Ber Nolan who is retiring from the committee after volunteering for a number of years.

Apprenticeships

Our Community Tutor Apprenticeship programme continues though it has been disrupted somewhat because of COVID19. We are hoping to support at least six to complete SHEP Tutor Training Apprenticeships over the coming months.

UCC Diploma Info Evening for SHEP Graduates

The UCC Diploma will be open for applications again in early Summer – as the intention is that the next course will start in September. The course will probably be open for applications (directly to UCC) in the early Summer. An information session for SHEP Graduates will take place on Wednesday, May 12th at 7pm (on-line).

New SHEP Scholarship Initiative

Erasmus Plus – Programme Extended because of COVID19

We have secured an extension to our current Erasmus Plus grant funding – which allows us to support personnel to travel to Europe for training. The last training undertaken was in March 2020 when SHEP was able to send four of our facilitators to Germany to do the Foundation Training in 'Theory U'. No mobilities are currently possible – and it will be some months before the situation will change. Do keep researching possibilities for late 2021 and early 2022.

Very Successful 'Heart of Front-line Practice' Conference – November 2020

Heart of Frontline Practice is an innovative collaboration involving SHEP and Ag Eisteacht. Our first conference took place in November (on-line because of COVID) and had over 70 participants at the one-day event. Feedback was very positive.

Work with National Youth Council of Ireland.

We are continuing to support the National Youth Council of Ireland. This year our focus will be on working with them to provide reflective practice training with youth workers.

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
