# **Important News**

### **Relationships in Practice**

The initiative which placed Relationships in Practice in the Social and Health Education Project (SHEP) came to an end on May 11<sup>th</sup>. We would like to thank everyone who contributed to the initiative. Relationships in Practice can be contacted at training@relationshipsinpractice.ie.

#### **Mid-West Programme**

As you know, the Mid-West Steering group has been actively working for sometime to establish a sustained core funding base for SHEP Programme activity in the region. While progress has been made, at this moment in time, this has not been achieved. This means that while we can plan locally in the Mid-West for the near term, planning for the long-term becomes more difficult. We now have a very solid Tutor based trained up in the Mid-West region. We also have a significant programme of work in the Mid-West at present, supported by the Mid-West Drug and Alcohol Forum and Healthy Ireland. We are committed to delivering on this while at the same time taking first steps towards reducing our activity level in the region to a level which can be sustained within available budgets and regional core funding. We had planned a Limerick-Kerry Facilitation Training Course for this year but this is not now going ahead – such a training makes sense when the resources are secure to sustain a longer-term programme vision.

### **ETB-funded Ardfoyle Horticulture Project**

SHEP has been asked to take over the sponsorship and management of the ETB-funding Horticulture Training Initiative at Ardfoyle, commencing September 2024. The SHEP Management Committee sees this as an important opportunity to further put into practice SHEP's commitment to promoting environmental sustainability and care of the Earth.

### New 'Climate Action' Funding awarded to SHEP

We are delighted to announce that SHEP has been awarded €100,000 by Cork City Council's Climate Action Fund to support our new Climate Action Project.

### **Counselling Programme Changes**

There are some important changes happening in SHEP's counselling programme team. Toufik Messibah is stepping down from the coordination of the LIB Counselling and Outreach programme he founded, and brought to SHEP, to concentrate on his private practice. He will be a huge loss to us but will stay connected to SHEP. We wish to congratulate Sheila Kelleher who will take over from Toufik in the LIB Coordination Role and who will also take on some of the role previously overseen by Nuala Burke who will semi-retire in the Autumn. We will shortly be advertising for a part-time counsellor to work on our TUSLA-funded Children's Counselling Service.

### **Training & Development Staff Changes**

As you know, there have been significant changes in the training team recently. Deirdre O'Sullivan will also be retiring in early June – and we will miss her dearly. Liam McCarthy will be moving to a three-week from the Summer. We have advertised a new, full-time Senior Training and Development Officer post and we expect that process to be completed shortly.

### Foundation 1 – Applications Now Open

Finally, we have decided to bring forward our application process for our Foundation Programme and to have a significantly earlier closing date. Our intention is to complete the registration for as many of the Foundation One groups as possible before the Summer, so as to reduce pressure on the staff team in the Autumn, which is our busiest time of year. Applications for Foundation One are now open - please do help us by saying this to people you know who might be interested. Much appreciated!

We were all very saddened by the passing of Mary Lane in November 2021. She will be remembered as a kind, warm-hearted and very influential member of staff. She also worked in the early years of the Advocacy Service and worked for many years facilitating SHEP groups in community settings. She was a huge influence for good in peoples' lives and is very much missed.

She showed up in the group, just as she was in that moment, innocently, with no mask or pretence. A lovely gift to our group.'

Finally, we also remember at this time our friend, tutor and volunteer advocate, Una Furey, who sadly passed away in 2023. Pictured here with Ann O'Sullivan at the Cork Certificates Event in Cork at the Meditation Centre, Bessboro, circa 2012, Una was very committed to SHEP. Deirdre Lillis, who worked closely with Una on the SHEP Advocacy Programme recalls that 'Una was dedicated to the advocacy work she was involved with for over twenty years. She worked closely with Helen Mackessy for over ten years with people leaving an institution where they had lived their lives, supporting them to have their voices heard in their transitions to their own homes. My last meeting with her the week before she died included us singing together 'Only Our Rivers'. She was a very proud Irish woman. I miss her.'
